More Americans are
going to the polls
than ever before. But
will they vote?
That's the question.



The November 2-1968
elections, less than 10 million
Americans can vote.
But will they American
really go to the polls and
cast their vote?
That's the question. Before
most people show their
before the election.

In the presidential election
of 1968, about 63 out of every 100
Americans who could vote did.
By 1972, the number of
Americans voting for a President
had dropped to 70 out of every
100.

How many people are voting
in this year's presidential
election the year around and
in every state.

Concerned as it is, Congress
is trying to find out the
reason for this. If you're a majority
group, then half of eligible
persons will not vote in a
political election.

Who Doesn't Vote?

What kind of Americans
refuse to cast a ballot on Election
Day?
Studies of past elections show
that nonvoters are mostly men,
people. They live in cities. They
have less than a high school
education. They are in the
lowest income group. They are
black. They are not
married.

THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION OF 1968
WAS THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1900
THAT FEWER THAN 70 PERCENT OF
ELIGIBLE AMERICANS VOTED.
THE REASON FOR THIS IS NOT
CLEAR, BUT IT IS A CONCERN
OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.
